Community of Joy Mission Endowment Fund: Enhancing Our Impact

A Brief Overview of the Fund:

Established on May 15, 1997, the Community of Joy Mission Endowment Fund, formerly known as the Christ Lutheran Church Mission Endowment Fund, has served to support our mission-driven initiatives. Over the years, the Fund has grown to exceed \$200,000 which is conservatively invested in income-producing securities (government backed bonds and certificates of deposit). The Fund's bylaws mandate that the principle of all gifts remain invested in the Fund. However, the earnings they generate are given to deserving organizations beyond our congregation, enabling them to help do our Lord's work. Early this year the earnings from 2023 allowed us to provide gifts totaling \$6,475. We project that this year's earnings will allow us to have an even greater impact next year.

How you can have an impact:

We invite you to join us in furthering our mission by supporting the Community of Joy Mission Endowment Fund. Examples of ways to contribute to the Fund are:

- Bequests in wills
- Life insurance proceeds
- Naming the Fund as a beneficiary in trusts
- Memorial gifts
- Donating appreciated stock

Or "just a gift that keeps on giving."

As you consider your charitable giving, we encourage you to include the Community of Joy Mission Endowment Fund in your planning. Every contribution, regardless of size, contributes to our collective efforts to foster positive change within our community. Whatever the source of your gift, you can be assured that the principle will remain intact, allowing for your gift to have a continuing impact far into the future.

Annual Fund Allocations:

The Fund Team has traditionally allocated donations to non-profit organizations across three key categories:

- ELCA Church-Wide Initiatives (\$2,000 in 2024)
- AR/OK Synod Support (\$2,000 in 2024)
- Local Mission Organizations (\$2,475 in 2024)
