## Evangelical Lutheran Church in America Living in God's amazing grace

Dear Community of Joy:

I have enjoyed hearing how some of you have processed the season of Epiphany and how you are preparing yourself for Lent!

Based on the overarching idea of Love being related to me I decided to write this article by baring my soul on what epiphany means from my perspective. Maya Angelou said that epiphany, was a time that "I am loved by Love Itself. There is nothing good that I can't do."

This makes so much sense. I agree, "We are indeed loved by Love itself. Love fills us and empowers us. Love walks with and alongside us. Love animates our lives and moves us to action. And Love never fails."

All things are made possible with that kind of Love. That's not saying we won't face difficult things. Newspapers and newsfeeds bombard us with reasons to doubt the power of Love in the world. The recent acts of terror and violence committed against our elderly Asian community in our cities from Los Angeles to New York City reflect how vulnerable we are at times. The youth of our communities are being confronted with bullying in their schools, subject to physical violence because of cultural/political differences, and told that they are not worthy people until and unless they practice a particular faith. I have heard these comments too many times: "it's my way or the highway" or "I am in pain and deserve to be compensated" or "until you walk in my shoes you can't understand me". Racial bias is running rampant, and we even have people in power positions calling for a "Red" and "Blue" divide (divorce) in our nation – it reminds me of the "north" vs "south" mentality on racial equality.

Will we allow such events and ideas to isolate us and our loved ones out of fear? To push us away from community? Will we succumb to evil, or will we stand up for the "light" that is within us.

We've heard that Love conquers all. Does this include conquering the pervasive evil in the world?

It sounds "pie-in-the-sky-ish", but I think Love <u>can</u> conquer – AND cover - a multitude of evil things. Love can do the impossible – it can transform, renew, reconcile, make peace – but it requires something. Love needs a body to do its work.

Love needs hands and feet and the will to act. Love needs generous hearts, willing souls, determined minds and persistent strength. Love needs us to act. If Love requires anything, it requires our YES and our participation.




#### **Greetings from the Singles Group.**
