At its core, the resurrection of Jesus becomes evidence that God is present and active in the world doing something new to restore God's relationship to humanity.

Resurrection is not just a story in the Bible, though. It is the story of how God is working in our lives, bringing us out of death and into life. Resurrection is therefore not an event that occurred in the past nor is it an event that will occur in the future. Resurrection is in the here and now and we are the witnesses.




The month of February ended with a surplus of \$7,262 for the month and \$40,136 for the year-to date. Income is over budget and expenses are under budget.


Love Lunches on Sunday April 7th

One of the outstanding topics that remains from the merger is the possibility of a name change for Community of Joy. The Church Council feels that it is time to address this topic. Town Hall Meetings are scheduled to allow members to express their ideas and thoughts. There will be two meetings, we encourage everyone to attend at least one of the meetings, but we welcome you to attend both.

There will be a brief overview of the cost, process, and issues that need to be addressed. Then the meeting will be an open forum, and we encourage all members to express their ideas, concerns,

and feelings regarding a name change. No suggestions of names will be presented at this time.

After the two Town Hall Meetings, a Congregational Meeting will be held and a vote taken. The vote will be "Change the name of Community of Joy?" Yes or No. If the vote is "Yes" then a committee will be formed to determine a process for selecting a new name and then how to implement that process.
